- 1. Progress at KS2 has been poor in recent years, particularly for children from disadvantaged backgrounds.
- 2. The number of children from disadvantaged backgrounds working at greater depth in Reading, Writing and Maths at EYFS, KS1 and KS2 is significantly lower than other children nationally.
- 3. Social and emotional barriers have led to children having fixed mind-sets, low levels of confidence and motivation.
