Each day there will be a starting point. This may be a video from me, or a short film or a picture. Then I will list activities that you could do based on the starting point. Ideally children would tackle one of the writing tasks every day – but I'm not counting ;)

## **Monday**

Mystery scene (video on Tapestry and website)

Write the story of what might have happened

Make a film of what might have happened

Pretend to be a character from the scene and tell your side of the story

Pretend to be an investigator and interview people to find out what happened

Make your own mystery scene

Make some miniature objects (a door, a tea set, armour, a piano – the list is endless)

Film the battle scene

Describe the battle scene

## **Tuesday** – video on Tapestry and Website

Write a set of instructions that might help me escape

Write a story of someone who got stuck/trapped

Make a miniature treehouse for a mouse

Make an 'escape' scene in a shoe box

Make a den

Make a film or a trailer for an exciting escape film

Use your electricity knowledge to make an intruder alarm

## **Wednesday**

Picture – On Tapestry and the Website

Do some of the writing or drawing activities from the Pobble365 page

Make up your own desert island – in the garden or on paper

Have a ‘desert island’ adventure

Make a list of the 5 things you would want with you on a desert island and tell me why

Make a video diary of your time stranded on an island

Design a beautiful desert island house

Do an advert for a beautiful house on an island either as a holiday home or to try to sell it – be persuasive with your language

Write a persuasive argument to convince people not to come to your island

Research a small tropical island and find out about the wildlife that lives there

## **Thursday** – video The little boat – link on Tapestry

This is a strange beautiful video – you might love it, you might not!

You could write the story or part of the story.

You could make your own boat – will it float? Does it get blown along by the wind

Make your own animation of an inanimate object having an adventure

Make your own battle scene

Research a bit about the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> World wars

Write the diary of a soldier

Make an 'adventure' marble run where your marble goes through different objects or booby traps

Make your own boat adventure

Make a boat out of household objects (laundry basket?) that's big enough to get in – have an imaginary boating adventure

## **Friday**

Today is a free story day. Write a story about anything you like.

Make a backdrop for your setting

Film your story using paper figures or toys

Draw a comic strip for your story

Paint a beautiful picture of your main character

Record yourself reading your story and create sound effects

Get your family to dress up and help you act out the story!

Make your story into a picture book and enjoy illustrating it either by hand or take photos

Create a rap that goes with your story – use the website Bensound to find backing music that it's legal to use.

Turn your story into a music video
